We also have a very special reading of the Violin Concerto, my 'big heavy-weight concerto', in the composer's words. Its sheer extravagance and dreamy sensuality mark it out from the economy and control of more familiar Britten. This may not be a flawless reading (some of Tasmin Little's double stopping being just short of immaculate), but Little and Gardner plumb its emotional heart in a performance of great passion and spontaneity. There's a sense not just of supple flow from Little, but an incandescent commitment to the work. She finds something more febrile than James Ehnes (reviewed below) in the central Vivace, and Gardner draws it to a menacing climax. The range of dynamics is also wider, with barely audible pianissimos in the cadenza, while the 'Passacaglia' is allowed to dream its way into a profoundly moving meditation. Helen Wallace \*\*\*\*

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
